ALCOHOL WISE—JV

provides relevant alcohol and drug information to teens. The student can compare personalized feedback with social norms, review social skills, tips for building relationships, and gain a better understanding of the healthy choices available today. The course is interactive and requires 4 hours to complete. A certificate is awarded at the completion along with an risk assessment for the probation officer.

Marijuana 101

Marijuana 101 is an online course designed as an intervention and prevention program that addresses the impact of marijuana on the individual, impact on society, social and family relationships, and provides tools and resources to quit using marijuana.

YES PROGRAM

YES (Youth Educational Shoplifting Program) is an online educational workshop for both youth and parents. This workshop attempts to make young offenders aware of the seriousness of shoplifting. It explores decision-making and reasoning skills as it relates to shoplifting. YES also teaches young offenders how the law defines shoplifting. This workshop requires 4 hours of interaction from the offender to complete. A certificate is awarded at the end along with a risk assessment for the probation officer.

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BEHAVIORAL COURT PROGRAMS

ANGER MANAGEMENT

This program aims to help youth focus on and find solutions to unmanageable anger and rage. This is a weekly program and it runs in 4 week cycles.

CHOOSE FREEDOM

Provides viewpoints of both male and female offenders with the Georgia Dept. of Corrections. The forum delivers powerful and in-depth information about the lives of the inmates who are serving time in a correctional institution.

MINDS UNDER CONSTRUCTION



POINTS II

The **POINTS** (Providing Optimal Intervention Needed To Succeed) II Program is taught by School Resource Officers as a means of diverting all minor school related non-violent offenses from having charges filed with the Juvenile Court.

THINKING FOR A CHANGE

Thinking for a Change is a curriculum developed by the National Institute of Corrections. The curriculum uses as its core a problem solving component that integrates both cognitive restructuring and social skills interventions.

ADDICTION COURT PROGRAMS

C.A.P.E.S. (STEPS) (Chemical Awareness Prevention Education Series)

STEP is a substance abuse prevention program serving ages 13-21. The STEPS Program is based on the Lifestyle Risk Reduction curricula designed for youth and gives "age appropriate expectations for abstinence."

SUPER STOP

Super Stop is a family prevention education program that is designed to build stronger families by increasing participant's awareness of how they experience and respond to conflict in everyday life situations.

F.R.E.S.H.

(Finding Reasons to End Shoplifting)

This program aims to help youth understand the reasons why people should not shoplift and the people affected by stealing.

OTHER COURT PROGRAMS

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

This class combines the training and technology of the newest electronic "babies" with the practical knowledge found in the hands-on experience of caring for a baby. The economic and social expectations of parenting along with the daily responsibilities of a newborn are introduced.

FAMILY STRENGTHENING PROGRAM

Family Strengthening Program (FSP) consists of eight-weeks of family intervention; family and group counseling for participants and their family members. FSP has a highly structured curriculum that consists of self-discipline and guided group discussions designed to help youth overcome their negative behaviors and become productive members in society.

ERA OF NEW LEADERS

This program aims to help youth understand the truth behind gang involvement and strives to redirect current youth who may be involved. It teaches them ways to get out and stay away from gang life.

C.H.I.N.S.

(Children In Need of Services)

Based on the needs of the community and the population that will be served, a curriculum was developed using various creative methods targeting specific areas of basic life skills. A parental piece was added to provide support and resources to ensure parents had the knowledge to communicate and advocate for their children.
